

Seekers - Afternoon activities

Welcome back seekers! We hope you liked the lunchtime live group.

This afternoon we have some different activities for you to do. We have talked a lot about the words in our Bible verse and what they mean.

If you are lucky enough to have a garden, and you are allowed go out into it, maybe you could go out and take some time practicing the movements that we did for Eagles wings. Imagine being an eagle.



When you are out there, can you see if there are any leaves laying on the ground? If there are, can you pick them up and collect them? You will need them for one of our next art projects. Don't worry if you can't go out, you could soar like an eagle around the house looking for scraps of paper or tissue.

We have got 2 art projects for you to do this afternoon, and of course there's lots more colouring. You can choose which you want to do.

Our first craft is **designing your own eagle** to hang in your home

Hopefully your Mums/Dads/guardians have printed the eagle template for you (you can find it on our Stay Awake website). Remember to ask for their help when you need to use scissors!

Here are the instructions:

Bunjil Leaf Craft Activity

Materials and equipment

Eagle template

Dried leaves

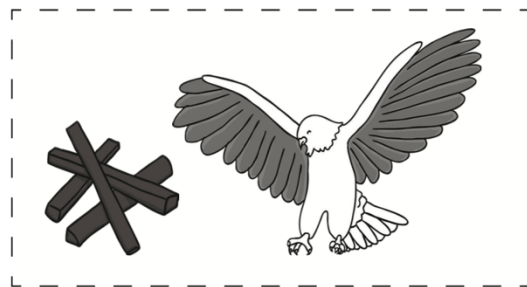
White glue (such as PVA)

Charcoal or black pastels



Bunjil Leaf Craft Activity

Step 1: Colour in the Bunjil template using charcoal or pastels.



Bunjil Leaf Craft Activity

Step 2: Use the white glue to stick the leaves to your Bunjil to make it look like feathers.



Bunjil Leaf Craft Activity

Step 3: Cut out the Bunjil and display it by hanging from the ceiling.



Use some glue and stick on the leaves you collected in your garden.

These can be your eagle's wings! If you don't have leaves, don't worry. You could colour them or use any scraps of tissue or fabric you can find lying around the house or perhaps use old shredded pieces of paper from a magazine or newspaper your parents or guardians no longer want.

Our second craft project involves **play-doh!**



Try rolling out your play-doh onto a tray and make some footprints or handprints, how long does your footprint or handprint last?

In our bible verse it says “ **...they will walk and not grow faint.**” What do you think this means? Maybe you can think about this whilst you are walking on your play-doh, just make sure it is on a tray!

Can you find some of your toys and try pressing their feet into the play-doh, what shape prints do they leave behind? Can you make a pattern?

.....Later on, you can create these footprints out of flour and bake it in the oven! You can then keep these as a memory of our Stay Awake day. You will need a parent or guardians help with this, so you may have to wait until the talks are finished, but you can practice your design with the play-doh!

Lastly, let's take this time as we come to the end of our day together to thank God in prayer.
